Background:

1. Vision:

By allocating an amount from church fund and the support received from generous friends and church members from all over the world, it is aimed to establish a fund to support those children for their education who otherwise can't start or continue their education. Our vision is to see - those underprivileged children become honest, responsible and educated individual with morals and patriotic values. We understand this is an act of love prompted by our faith in Jesus Christ and a joint endeavour of co-workers in Him.

2. Principle (Mission):

Lamachaur Church has started a program called, 'Scholarship Fund for Education (SFE)' which will raise funds for Education in particular. Our mission is to make these funds available to those individuals including church members and non-members, who chiefly, due to financial difficulties cannot afford for their school or higher education including vocational training to young people.

4. The Criteria for Support:

The students fall under poor and one or more other categories namely, orphanages, children with a single parent, from within or outside the church communities.

The educational support is provided for: One off support for instance, fee one time, School dress only, Tuition fee only, fixed amount of money on a regular basis (monthly), Stationery only, Or full support for all costs born for education.

5. The Components of this Report:

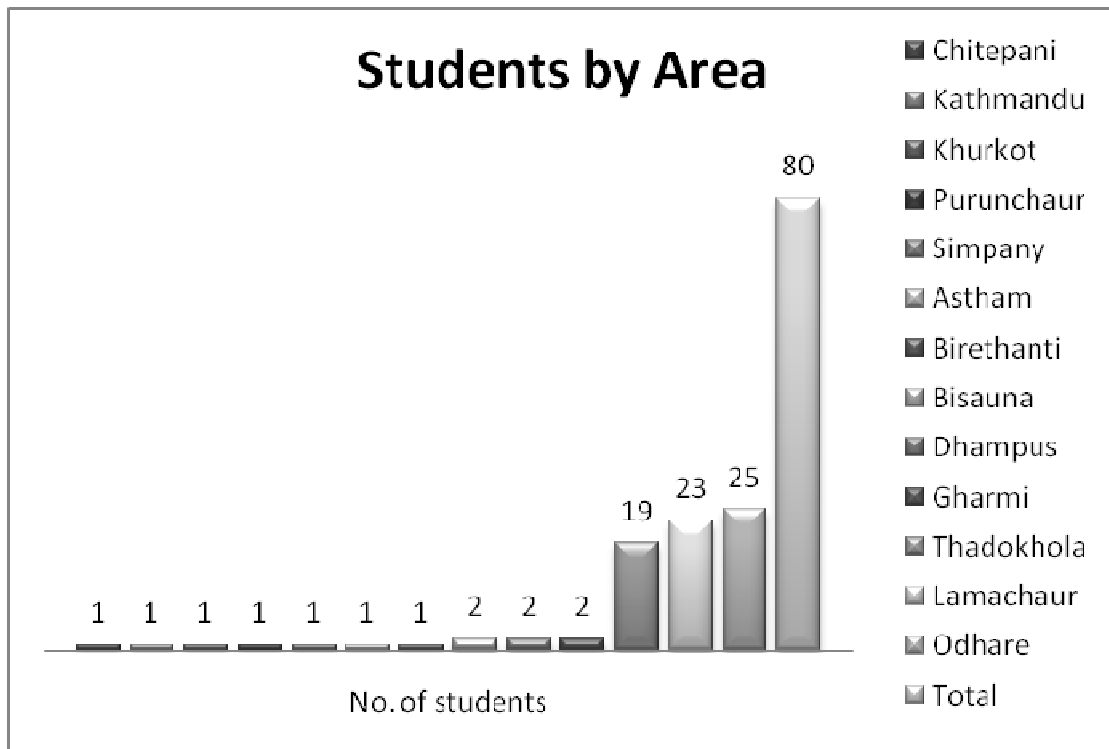
This is a report highlighting the main aspects of the Scholarship Fund for Education. It aims to

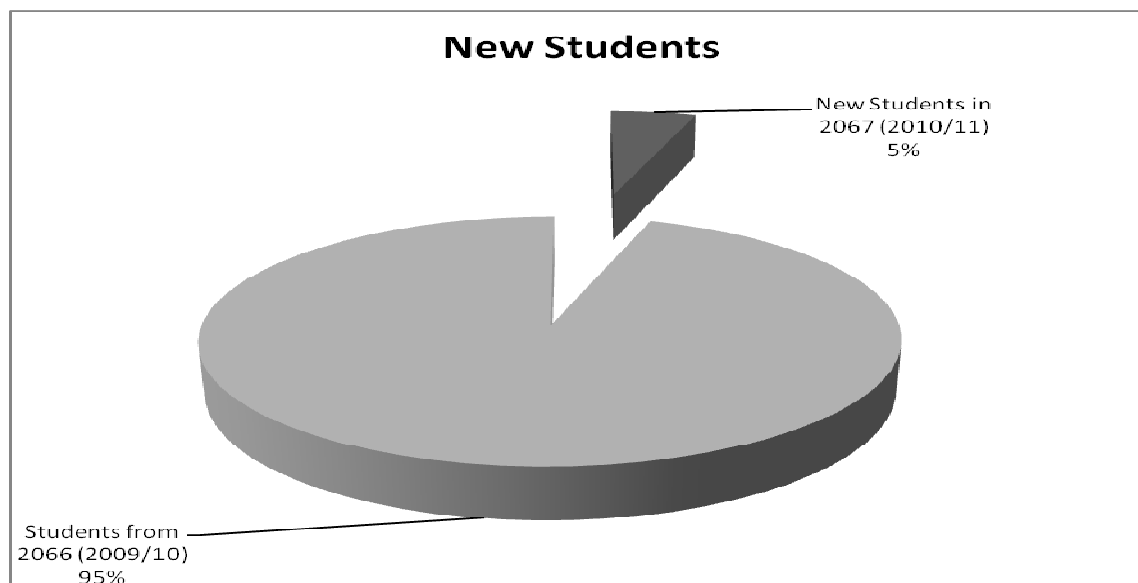

Situational Report 2067 (2010/11):

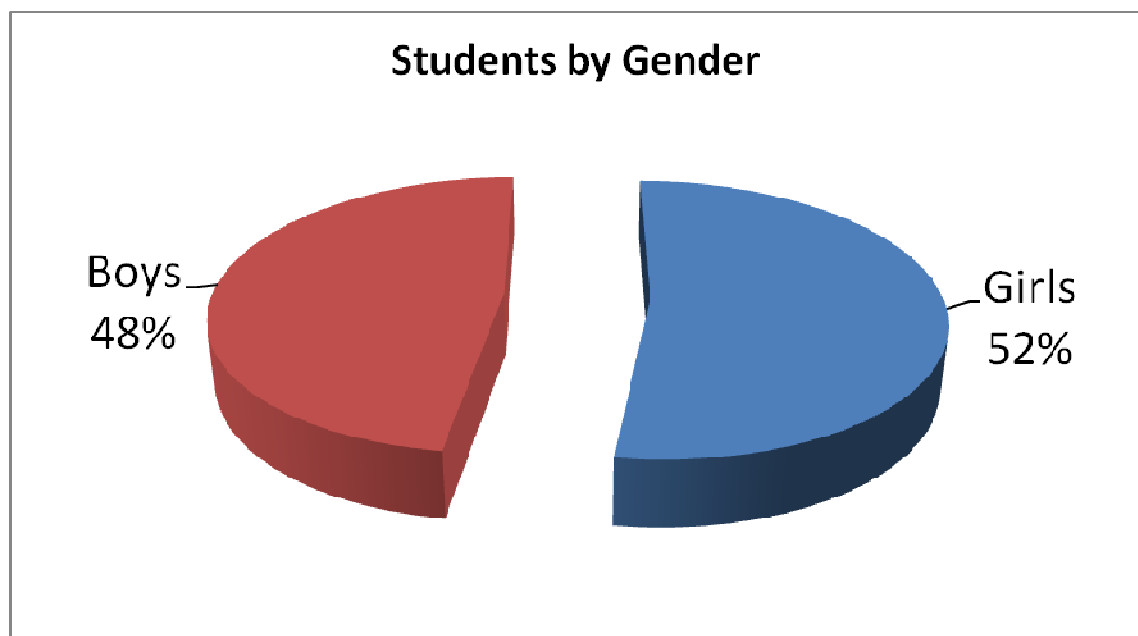
1. Students by Area: The scholarship programme supports 80 children in 2067 (2010/11) from 13 different villages and in most of those villages the church has its branch fellowships.



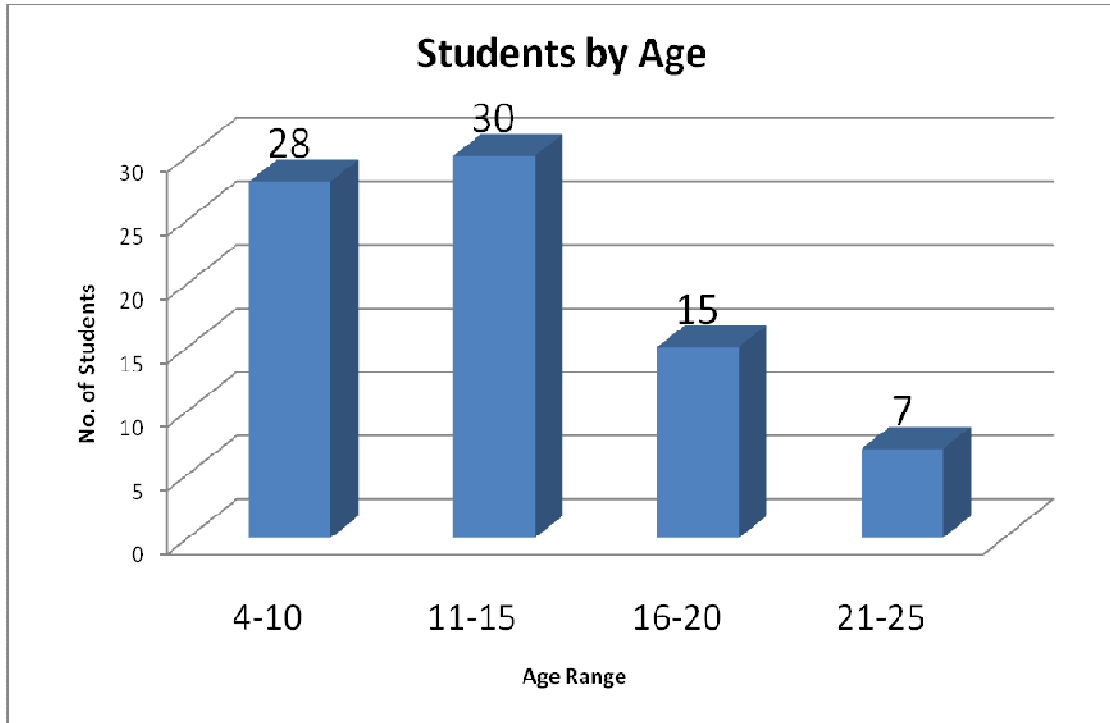
2. **New students in 2067 (2010/11):** There were 4 (5%) new students added to the scholarship fund this year.



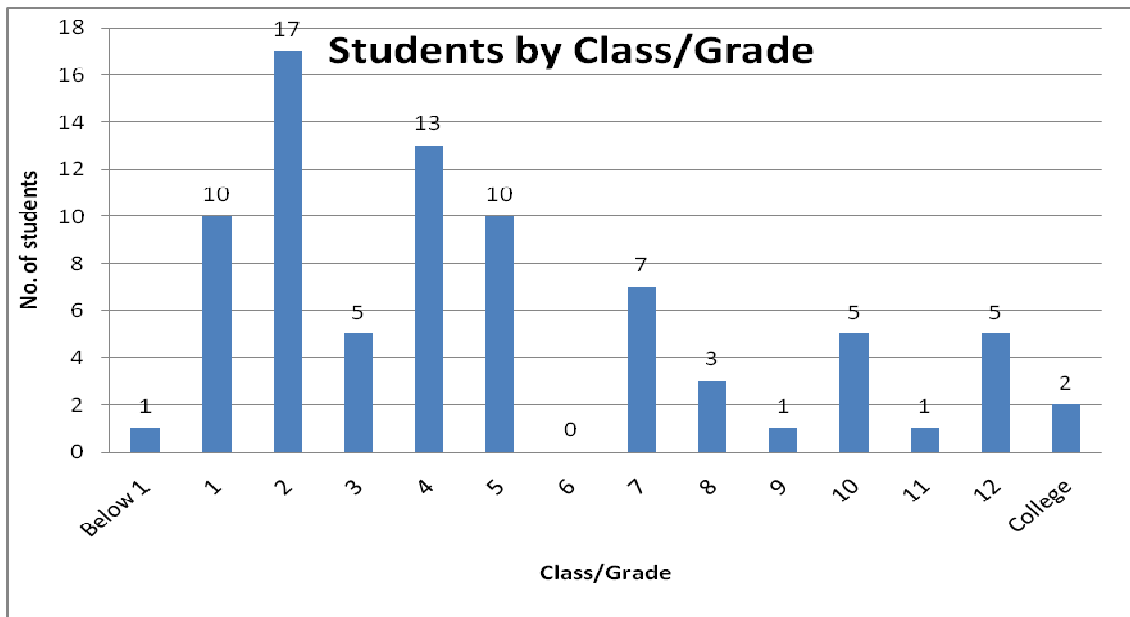
3. **Students by Gender:** There are 42 (52%) female students and the rest are boys. The scholarship programme emphasises on equal opportunity for education to both girls and boys.



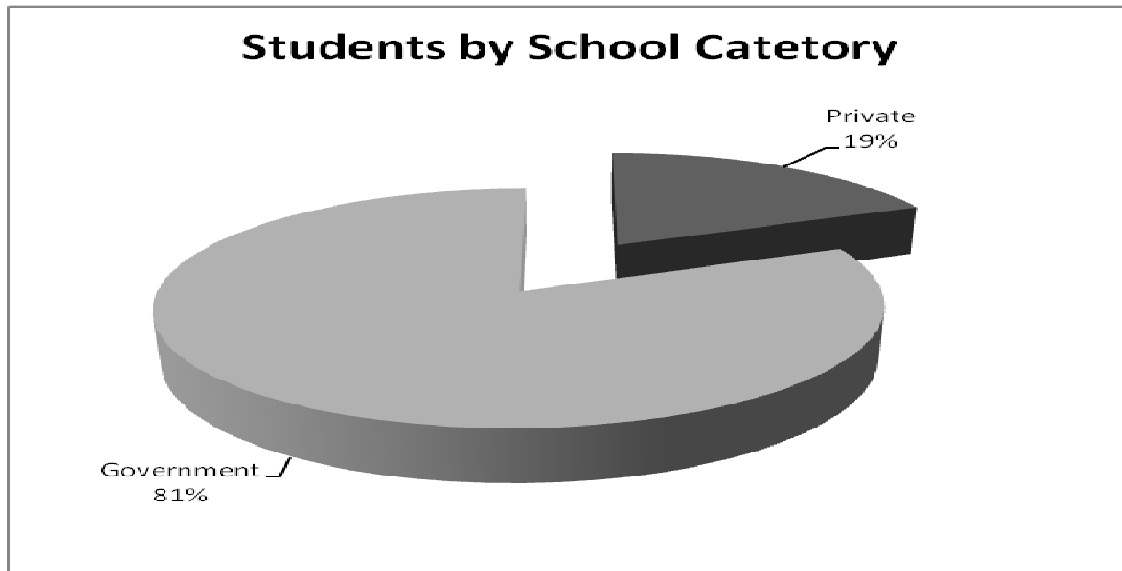
4. **Students by Age:** 72% (28+30) students are under the age of fifteen. Age 21-25 includes the students studying at higher secondary and college (bachelor) level.



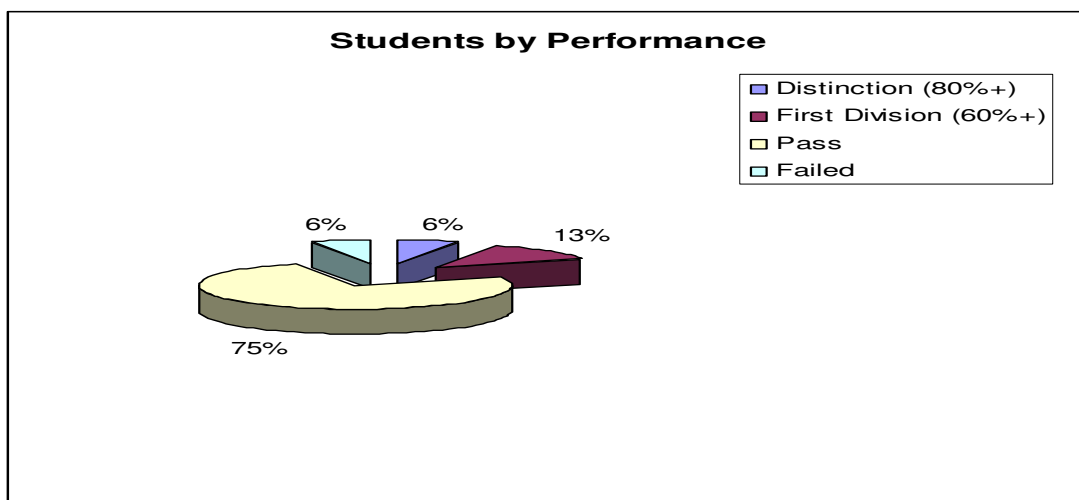
5. **Students by Grade:** Most of the students are studying at primary and secondary levels. The highest number of students are in grade 2, they are 21% of the total students and none are studying in grade 6.



6. **Students by School Category:** Private schools are run in the English medium and have a better education, therefore they are far more competitive than the government schools. However the government schools are significantly cheaper than the private ones. 65 (81%) of the total students are studying at different government/community run schools.



7. **Students by Performance:** It is a challenge to help children continue their education particularly in Odhare and Thadokhola. There were 97 students that started in the beginning of the program but it ended up with 80 this year including some new intakes each year. Thadokhola and Odhare have had highest dropout rate. Nevertheless, it is a real excitement to see many students progressing to higher levels of education, Yanimaya is an example, she is studying in class 9 and is the person with the highest education in her tribe. She is now helping other children by conducting extra classes in the church.



Impacts of the educational support fund:

It is important to have knowledge about the impact of the scholarship fund on beneficiaries. On how the resources, that has been sacrificially contributed to by many friends of the USA, Korea and within Nepal, have been used and the fruits it has bore, they are also important to count. In order to have a picture of this below are examples from the students, families and the school teachers opinions have also been included.

1. The stories of three mums:

Tasbira Gurung (parent): Tasbira Gurung, of around 50, is disabled and struggling alone to take care of all the household members. Her husband went abroad years before and had no communication for long-time. Even though he is in touch these days, he is not yet taking care of the family. Tasbira breaks stones for concrete and this is only the income for the whole family to live on. They do have a little temporary hut at the Seti river side. The family migrated from a remote part of eastern Nepal 5 years before due to intense Maoist conflict. The children also work hard to help mum and carry on their own



education and further more they are growing in faith too. Sabita studies at a university grade 12 and Bimala at a school grade 8. Tasbira says, "Due to poverty and lack of capacity to afford the children's education, I went to request the Church Scholarship Committee for help. Without the help from the church, my children would have not been able to study at all. I express my heartfelt thanks to the church committee and all who have enabled me to send my children to school. At the same time, I wish many other children who similarly struggle like mine would also receive such support for their education."

Story of Dilmaya Dube (parent): Dilmaya, around 48, is from a lower-caste background and was working in the police service. She married to a high cast Brahmin man who was an officer in the same department. After marriage, she quit the service as per the demand of family, to be able to pay more attention to the children – Deepma, Bikram and Sashi. Unfortunately, she had to face her husband's unexpected death and became a widow. She was really worried and anxious about the future, how she would take care of the children. She made a



request for help for the children's education to the Church Committee through some other church members. Deepma and Bikram both have been supported for their education. Both are studying bachelors. Sashi the youngest one, is receiving help since last year and now awaits for the result of School Leaving Certificate exams, which will be published soon. Dilmaya says, "My children were helped when I was alone struggling hand-to-mouth. Without the support, my children's desire to have a higher education would have not been fulfilled. I can't imagine that I would be able to help them. The support helped my children not only to have good education but also in development of good characters such as good discipline, hardworking and role models for many. I, from my heart, express thanks and appreciation for helping me in such a need. Children with enormous potential for great achievement should not be deprived from the opportunity to have a good education and I wish the scholarship fund be able to support more widely." Deepma and Bikram both are active in the church ministries. Bikram started full-time church work since the beginning of this year and carries his studies simultaneously.

Samjhana Adhikari: Samjhana is a young lady of age approximately 25. Her husband died in



an accident and she became helpless to raise the young son, Avijit. She was in a desperate need of help. She says, "I had been going through a deep experience of loss for my husband and at the same time had worries about the future and the challenges approaching me in life. Fortunately, I met Krishna sir at INF, where I was given some work to do and shared about my situation with him. Krishna sir kindly referred me to the Church Scholarship fund to see the possibility for support for my little son Avijit. Without support from the church, my son would never have a chance to go to such a good school as I would not be able to afford it for him. It is a great support to me. I was so happy then to hear from Krishna sir about the positive response to my request from the Scholarship Committee. This is a novel work what Lamachaur Church Scholarship Committee is doing. I wish that Lamachaur Church is able to help more orphans and those who can't go to school due to lack of support and resources like mine."

2. The stories from the school teachers:

Mr. Y. Rana: Mr. Rana is the Principle of Alpha Boarding School at Lamachaur. It is one of the private schools giving good education to pupils. 11 Students who are supported from the scholarship support study there in different grades. He remarks that the poor families who received help from the church are able to send their children for better education. He further adds, "Without help we can't imagine how much these families would have been struggling and whether they would have sent the children to school or not". He stresses further that the scholarship support has created positivity and optimism in parents as they can dream of a better future for their children. Mr. Rana says, "The scholarship fund has not only provided support to the needy children but also contributed towards better society and ultimately, the nation, therefore it is a highly commendable effort".

Mr. Mukti Nath Khanal: Mr. Khanal is the Headmaster of Shree Vuwani Primary School at Tanahusur (Odhare). Most of our sponsored children at Odhare study in this school. He highlights that the scholarship programme is needed for the Chepang people, one of the most marginalised tribes in Nepal. They need encouragement to send their children to school, this will help get rid of extreme poverty and ignorance. If there was no initiation from the scholarship fund, the Chepang children would never have come to today's position. Their attitudes and appearances have changed significantly in recent years. He understands that the scholarship fund is helping the children towards a brighter future. He appeals by saying, "this community requires not only good education but also teachings and the practice of health and hygiene, and better management of resources." The similar story is shared by Mr. Krishna Prasad Panday, a teacher of Shree Bishnu Secondary School at Ghansi Kuwa, Nalah where most of the children of Thadokhola study in. He too states, "Continuing support to this community will help their children hope for a better future. Thank you for such a very significant effort for the welfare of this community."

3. Story that Pastor Krishna Bahadur Chepang shares:

Krishna is pastoring of a local church at Thodokhola. The church is a branch of Lamachaur Church. Krishna states that that poverty in the community has been severe and people do not have enough to eat even for six months of a year. They still have to rely on roots and other

produce from the forest. However, Krishna sees that development is happening, resulting in good behaviour and positive attitudes in the Chepang people. They do have clean running water and have learned to use toilets instead of going to jungle. Parents, due to the encouragements from around are gradually realising the importance of education for their children. Krishna expresses, "in our and our fathers' time there was no opportunity to read and write as we used to move from one place to another in the forest for living. But our children today have such an awesome opportunity for education. The scholarship support for our children's education has brought us happiness. Everyone who has given money to the scholarship fund and the committee who run it are highly appreciated for their contribution to our community." Krishna also suggests that there should be frequent visits and follow-ups from the board to parents, children and schools where the children study.

4. Stories of the children who receive support for education:

Yanimaya (Subina) Bhujel: Yanimaya realises that if she didn't have scholarship support, she would never be able to continue her study to class 9. She is the person having the highest education in her community. Yanimaya despite her study also helps other children by running extra tuition classes in the building of Thadokhola church. She further appreciates the support as she sees many positive changes in her life. She will not accept early marriage, which is very obvious in this community and wants to be an educated woman. She says, "my God who prompted his people to give out of their needs to support for the needy children like me, may God bless them abundantly in their needs too. Thank you."

Rosan Limbu: Rosan Limbu is a boy who migrated from a remote village of eastern Nepal when he was a small child. His father is a semi-skilled building worker. Mum has always been with ill health, requiring regular and expensive medication. He was recommended by the local community school Shree Indra Rajya Laxmi Secondary School of Lamachaur to the church for help. He had been a smart and a diligent student. He passed school in a good division and is now studying Engineering at the Regional Campus. He, his father and the school appreciate the scholarship support a lot. At the time of reviewing his contract, Rosan says, "I secured a subsidy at the college however, I often feel like crying when my dad does not have any money to pay even the rest of the minimal cost. I am using my old filthy dresses and I desperately need a pair of pants." Rosan also remarks that if he did not have support at school continuingly for higher education, he would not have this golden opportunity to study to be an Engineer. Rosan says, "I appreciate all your valuable support and each one who are involved in it. I express my deep gratitude to you all before the almighty God for your helping hands." Rosan has started coming to church and learning about faith.

Anila Maharjan: Anila is raised by her mum's effort alone. Father has been working abroad but hasn't been helping the family. Anila is the first of three girls. She is a smart and diligent student who secured 91% in the exams of class 10. With the support from the Scholarship Programme, Anila is able to study in a good school. She says the church scholarship support helped her overcome financial obstacles. As with other students, she also thinks that without support her family would not be able to send her school because even to meet the needs, such as food and clothing, has always been a struggle for her family. Anila appreciates the support saying, 'I would like to thank the sponsors and the organisers for creating such a program and helping many children like me. Without your help we would have not been in the position that we are now in. Much thanks to you. I hope that your support will continue to brighten many children's future'.

Lessons learned:

Proper planning, management of data and follow-up activities have been realised as critical to improve. Odhare and Thodokhola students in particular needed to be more focused due to higher dropout from schools. If one child doesn't go to school and wants to tend goats then it has effect on the others to leave schools. Early child marriage has been another obstacle for the continuation of school in this Chepang community.

Maintaining and updating data has been another area to improve. Filing and updating systems and information management is to be improved.

Time slack in reporting and providing information to the supporters in USA, Korea and other friends has also been not efficient. All these issues have vicious-circle effects on the others.

More prayers for the students and families have been other areas to develop. The bondage of poverty and the slavery of the power of myths and fiction and darkness need to be broken.

'Consideration' does not always work. There were some dropout students whom we encouraged to restart their schooling, but the results had not been exciting. So, there is a need for careful analysis and observation before making such decisions and the need to find other appropriate alternatives instead.

Actions for future improvements:

The decisions we make will be fed by broader information and data. Resources will wisely be allocated seeking more participation of relevant families in their children's education.

Data will be updated every three months. Regular follow ups to the children, schools and the families will be scheduled.

A clear responsibility sharing among the board members will be maintained and a clear Job Description will be given to the Scholarship Programme Assistant.

Frequency and the timing of communication with the donors will be decided mutually. The communication includes submission of budget, reports and issues for prayers.

Extra tuition classes in Odhare and Thadokhola will also be run and the one in Lamachaur will be made more effective.

The Scholarship Committee Meeting will focus on exploring from the word of God and prayers for the programme and the children in the meetings.

Feedbacks and advice will be sought from the praying and supporting friends on a regular basis.

Treasurer's Report

We are very much thankful to our friends who have opened their heart to support the children in need. We have been experiencing the Lord's blessings through our friends. Their generous gift has made significant impact on the children's life here in Nepal. Even though there was a global financial crisis, our friends continued to support the Project. We have learnt to fully depend on God and follow his guidance over the years.

The year was started with good opening balance of Nrs. 737,109 (US\$ 10,530). We received additional income of 1,420,928 (US\$ 20,299) during the year. The total expenditure for the year 2010/11 was Nrs. 685,831 (US\$ 9,798). This resulted good closing fund position at the year end. The closing balance is Nrs. 1,472,206 (US\$ 21,032) which represents Nrs. 142,740 (US\$ 2,039) for general fund, Nrs. 1,189,790 (US\$ 16,997) for USA support fund and Nrs. 139,676 (US\$ 1,995) for Korean support fund. Apart from this, the project also has a general reserve fund of Nrs. 200,000 (US\$ 2,850). Part of this closing balance will be used to cover the 2011/12 expenditure. The church is also trying to encourage the local financial support towards the project.

Notes to the budget for 2011/12

This budget has been prepared according to fund accounting. There will be 3 different operating funds: 1. General fund (unrestricted fund), 2. USA support fund (designated to 92 children), 3. Korean Support fund (designated to 14 children). The other fund is the Reserve Fund which is not an operating fund.

Income:

1. The general income is to cover the general administration and management costs.
This fund is also to be used to cover the costs of the sudden breakdown of equipments, accidental costs of staff and children etc. These costs can't be predicted and therefore not in the budget. If something happens unexpectedly then that should be covered from the general fund.
2. The additional income from USA friends for this year has been already received.
3. The project needs to receive minimum Nrs. 110,038 [US\$ 1,572] from Korean Mission to cover the full cost of the 14 children directly funded by them.

Expenditure

1. The total budget includes the cost of educational supports for 101 children. Out of 106, 87 children are supported by USA friends and the rest (14) are supported from the Korean Mission.
2. The staff cost includes:
 - Administrator part time (Mukti Dhakal about 15% of his time)
 - Full time Office Staff (Seeta Thapa 100%)
 - 1 part time tuition teacher (Manju BK)
 - 1 accountant (Binu Nepali 25%, other 25% is paid from Church's A/C)
 - 2 part time tuition teachers in Thadokhola and Odhare.
3. Staff training cost includes computer training and some effective office management training for the staff so that they can perform the job better.
4. Travel and follow up cost also includes the visit cost of the local church leaders in Thadokhola and Odhare to visit the children and their parents to ensure that the children are continuing their study and parents are supportive.
5. The 14 children's support cost is directly charged to the Korean Mission fund and other relevant costs are charged at a pro rata basis (@15%).
6. The administration costs such as meeting, staff training, hospitality, and miscellaneous costs are charged to the General Fund with the intention that money received from USA and Korea should go for the direct benefit of the children.

Prayer points:

- Pray for the children who are currently studying at schools and colleges. Other needs in their families may be met so the children can continue their education.
- Pray that the support provided for children's education also helps them grow in faith and bring them to faith if they are not in Christ yet.
- Pray that the church's relationship with the schools and communities through this effort may be strengthened.
- Pray for Seeta Magar, the Programme Assistant as she has to visit students, manage payments and update records.
- Pray that God may provide resources so that more students can be supported for their education.
- Pray for Mukti who directly deals with most of the obstacles to the children's education such as finding out for example reasons for dropout and tries to solve them.
- Pray that this effort may have positive impact in the lives of people and they may honor Lord Jesus Christ.
- Pray for the people, particularly friends in the US and Korea, who have been sacrificially giving to this fund, that they may have their needs met.
